FASN-Chemistry was recently awarded an NIH grant. His proposal received one of the highest chemistry ratings in more than 6 years. He received a congratulatory call from the office of NJ Senator Robert Menendez.

Dr. Stephen Hanson, Professor, FASN-Psychology received a prestigious \$1.2 million award from James S. McDonnell Foundation. Research funded by this award explores the measurement and modeling of brain imaging data against the backdrop of high-level cognitive processes such as language, categorization, and reasoning.

NIH Dollars by Type of award (Rutgers Newark FY2005)

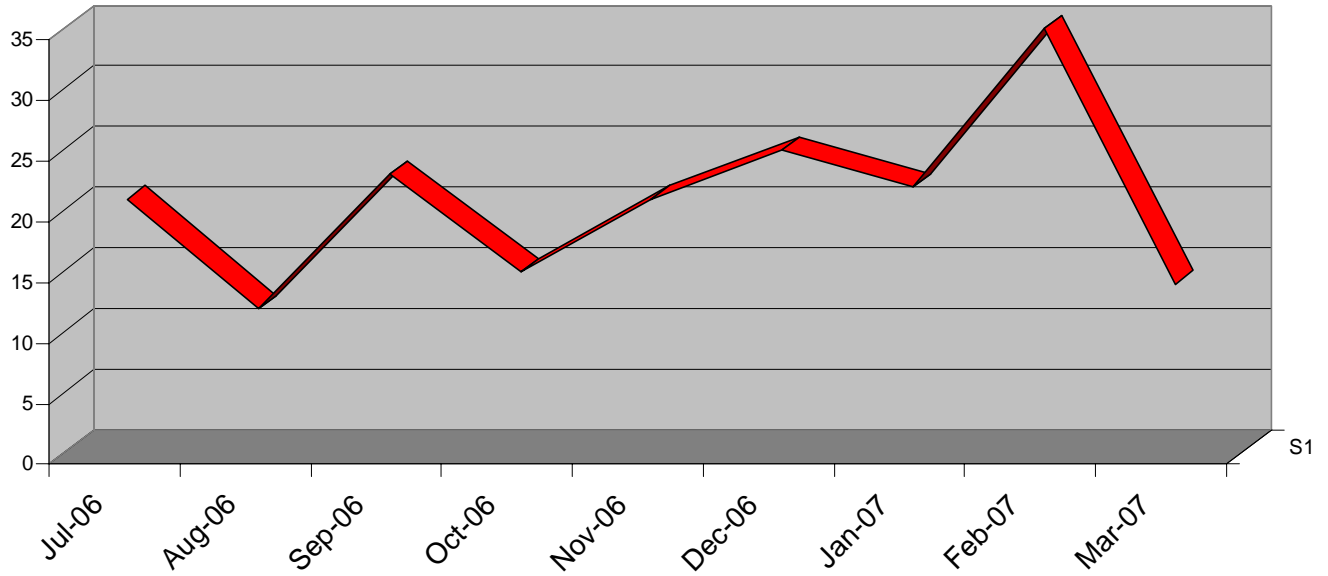

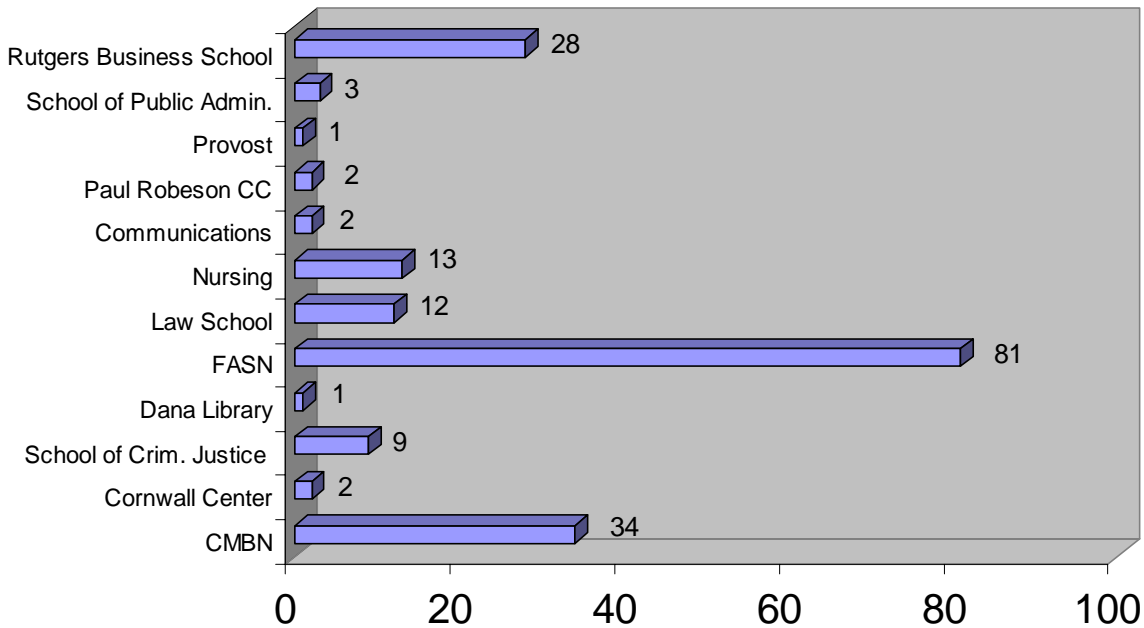

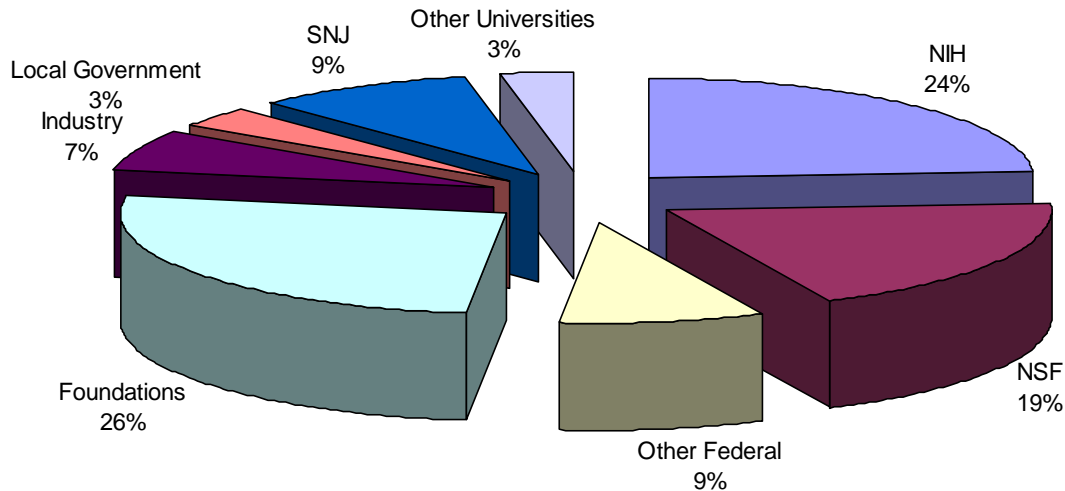
Rutgers-Newark - Number of Submitted Proposals by Month Jul 06-Mar 07
